Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP)

Part-time employment opportunities for eligible Lehigh and Northampton County residents 55 years of age and over.

Supported Employment Program (SEP)

Vocational assessment, job search assistance, on-the-job training and follow-along services for people with disabilities.

Welfare-to-Work

These include getting and keeping a job, planning a job search, building a work history, balancing family and personal life, and coordinating work and job-focused training or education. Please check with your Welfare Case Worker for more information and to determine if you are **ELIGIBLE** for enrollment in one of these programs.

Workforce Investment Act (WIA)

Intensive job search and/or vocational skills training assistance to eligible Lehigh and Northampton County youth and adults who are unable to secure employment after a period of active job searching, and who demonstrate a strong commitment to their employment goals.

Trade Adjustment Assistance Benefits (TAA/TRA)
